25 of equipment required for the methods. Include company names and trademarks when
26 applicable. Similarly, generic medication names should be used. If you are including abbreviated
27 terms within the paper, please initially write out the entire word/phrase, followed by the
28 abbreviation in parentheses. For example, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is written out
29 here and all following uses of the term can be written within the text as CPR.

31 Please provide a single space between paragraphs. If you want to include a website directly
32 within your article text, you can include the URL at the end of your sentence in parentheses
33 (insert URL Here). Your article should also include relevant references within the text via
34 superscript. This sentence is an example of an article sentence that refers to content from the
35 second reference in the reference list (Smith et al., 2021). A reference list should be included at
36 the end of the article in APA format. The list should be alphabetized and only include references

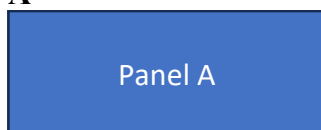

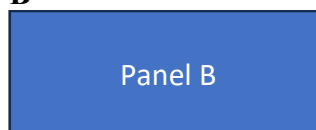
